
Map 1: Northern Fennoscandia




Map 2: The Norwegian coast near and to the south of Narvik




Map 3: Banak Airfield and the surrounding terrain




Map 4: The area of operations of Mountain Corps Norway




Map 5: The planned and actual advance of Mountain Corps Norway




Map 6: Positions of Group Lindinger on 29 June 1941














Map 12: Operations of the 6th Destroyer Flotilla in the Barents Sea, 1941






Map 14: The terrain leading towards Murmansk














Map 20: Furlough traffic between the Arctic Front and the Fatherland (4–6 days)
